

This year, we commemorate a great event. 1150 years ago, two men came to Great Moravia, who transformed the whole country through their work. Their names were Cyril (Constantine) and Methodius. They came from the city of Solun (Thessaloniki), which is located in the present-day Greece, a country warmed up by the sun, where the sky is beautifully blue all the year round. Since their childhood, both brothers excelled in their talents as well as in their faith in the Christian God and also in their desire to seek wisdom and justice. One day the emperor asked them to spread the faith in a faraway country belonging to Moravian Prince Rostislav. Rostislav very much wanted his subjects to learn to live in accordance with Christian truths. He needed such priests to come to Great Moravia who would devote their time and energy to his people and who would lead them, in a comprehensible way, to the life in compliance with Christian principles. Cyril and Methodius left for Great Moravia readily, without knowing if they would ever return home. They did not go with empty hands. Cyril created an alphabet for the Slavs - the Glagolitic alphabet - and he translated a part of the Bible into it. Methodius took care of books related to laws.

The brothers, accompanied by other learned men, reached Great Moravia in 863. Moravians welcomed them with enthusiasm. Immediately, Prince Rostislav introduced young men to them, who were willing to become their disciples. The brothers wanted to turn them into able priests and teachers who would help them among the people to spread mutual love and in the church to say masses in the Old Church Slavonic, i.e. the language people in Great Moravia understood. The brothers taught them not only to read, write, count, pray and spread the faith in an effective way but they also taught them methods of good husbandry, so that they would have abundant crops. The brothers also devoted their time to the simplest people who turned to them with their difficulties. With patience they showed to them that it was not right to believe in superstitions, fortunetellers and to worship trees, the sun or colored stones. Because these are only things created by God and nothing more. The brothers also encouraged people to do their work (e.g. manufacturing jewelry and ceramics) honestly, to do good farming in their fields and to take care of the properties entrusted to them in

People grew fond of the brothers. They realized that even though they were demanding on them, they liked them and cared for them. Also we, nowadays, live from the legacy of these men. Their disciples worked in the territory of the present-day Bohemia, Moravia, Slovakia, Hungaria, Bulgaria, Serbia and Russia, Poland and Croatia. They spread Christianity there in accordance with the model they had in the brothers of Solun and enhanced local culture.

By means of this art contest educators, teachers and animators can acquaint children, in an amusing way, with a significant anniversary, namely the 1150th anniversary of the arrival of Saints Cyril and Methodius to Moravia.

Methodology

Dear educators, teachers and animators, you have opened a document, in which we present you an offer, thanks to which you can acquaint children, by means of art, with an important anniversary, namely the 1150th anniversary of the arrival of Saints Cyril and Methodius to Moravia.

- we ask you to read and subsequently re-narrate the story of Saints Cyril and Methodius
- highlight the main ideas in your conversation with children
- during your conversation with children make sure they have understood the story
- talk to them about suitable topics they can process through their art
- please add a short description or characteristics of the author to the art processing, which will become part of the catalogue and the prepared exhibition
