# Bike Pilgrimage to Rome

## Velehrad – Padua – Rome 28<sup>th</sup> July – 12<sup>th</sup> August 2012

**Orel Uherský Brod organizes a bike pilgrimage again.** For the eighth time, a group of bikers will hit the road and set out for a pilgrimage the goal of which is – Rome!

The bike pilgrims will stream into the capital of Italy within the 1150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the arrival of Saint Constantine and Methodius to our territory. It is in Rome, in Saint Clement's Basilica that the grave of Saint Cyril is found. *The purpose of this happening is to undergo the same journey, which Saints Cyril and Methodius undertook in 867 when they went to ask Pope Hadrian II for a permission to use the Old Church Slavonic as the language of worship.* 

During the previous seven bike pilgrimages the bikers have already gone through cities like Bamberg, Frankfurt, Bratislava, Budapest, Cologne, Mainz, Vienna, Krakow, Czestochowa, and they have even crossed the whole Czech Republic from the border with Germany, all the way from Cheb, to the border with Slovakia on the east. Last year, they went for a bike pilgrimage to Spain. They covered the most well-known pilgrims' path in the world, to Santiago de Compostela.

Buses with bikes will transport the participants across the Alps. They will set out for their first biking stage from Padua. In the course of 8 stages, the bikers will also go through the cities of Ravenna, San Marino, Fabriano, or Perugie. In a free day they will have a rest in Assisi and in a famous Italian place of pilgrimage Loreto.

The event is open to all age groups, the same as it was in the previous bike pilgrimages. The individual stages will be planned so that even an average biker would manage.

Applications will be received by 31<sup>st</sup> May 2012. However, even at this moment, the organizers from Orel Uherský Brod have 90 participants registered already!! There are priests among them as well, who will take care of spiritual service during the journey, like it was during all the seven previous bike pilgrimages.

There will be buses as accompanying vehicles for the transportation of backpacks and service equipment. As part of the organization team, there will be also medical and service accompaniment for bike repairs, and a cook.

#### Other interesting facts:

703 bikers participated in the past seven bike pilgrimages, which is an average of 100 participants per one bike pilgrimage!

The bike pilgrimages connected altogether 4,170 km which is exactly the number of kilometers that would connect Uherský Brod with Rome and back by bike :-) And the last number will surely astonish! If we multiply the number of all participants, who have ever biked with us, by the number of kilometers biked during the individual bike pilgrimages, we will arrive at the unbelievable number of 402,560 km. Such a number of kilometers were biked together by all participants in the seven bike pilgrimages!
